

The Project

The SET Mentoring Project is an in school opportunity to involve students who face barriers such as intellectual, social, and emotional. It will help them explore future career options, community options and post-school options.

It's intended to help students transition into the community and/or work place after finishing high school.

This will be achieved by connecting them with adult trained "mentors" in the community.

The connection between students and mentors will be facilitated by a "Mentor Coordinator" working in tandem with school personnel, parents and community.

Through the assistance of adult mentors, students will have opportunities to learn about careers, explore community and volunteer options and alternatives for when they finish high school.

Additional in school support and training will assist students with social interaction, relationship building, and increasing self confidence while supporting their transition to community and/or the work place after high school. This will allow the opportunity for individual decision-making.

Mentoring will be individualized for each student.

Who Can be a Mentor?

- ✔ The mentor must demonstrate a strong commitment to inclusion and supporting self determination in students and mentors
- ✔ An innovator-- outside the box thinker, able to come up with alternative ideas in the community
- ✔ Should be knowledgeable about their community--people, resources, groups and organizations
- ✔ Varied experiences with individuals who have intellectual disabilities and autism
- ✔ Experienced with family engagement--planning.
- ✔ Demonstrates leadership in a variety of capacities--self/relational, professional, community.
- ✔ Coordination experience--strategic thinker, self disciplined, organized.
- ✔ Comfortable in school environments
- ✔ A natural teacher-- open to continuous learning and a team player.
